

LESSON 1-CHAPTER 1: WHAT ROAD WILL YOU TAKE?

ADVICE FOR CLG/YLG FACILITATOR

This lesson outline enables the person leading the discussion in a Community Life Group (CLG facilitator) or Youth Life Group (YLG facilitator) to have a deeper understanding of the lesson content so that they can direct and guide the discussion effectively. Therefore, the CLG/YLG facilitator is advised to read and understand the lesson outline before leading the discussion session.

It is beneficial for the CLG/YLG Members go through a process of self-discovery as they share experiences, thoughts and scripture in response to the questions set forth in this lesson. As such, the CLG/YLG Facilitator is encouraged to share the questions and memory verse first, then they can choose to share the lesson outline at the conclusion of the session.

Theme: Choosing the High Road (God's way) is about who we are in Christ rather than just what we do.

Lesson Outline:

- . The Low Road: living selfishly, harming others, people take more than they give
- The Middle Road: living for fairness, "eye for eye," maintaining the status quo, where nothing gets better or brighter
- . The High Road: choosing God's values, grace, and love.
- Our identity: Citizens of heaven, Ambassadors of Christ, Priests to God.
- Salt & Light: We influence the world by our character more than our words. (Mathew 5:13-16)
