

# **HOW TO FAST EFFECTIVELY (GUIDE)**

### WHAT IS FASTING?

Biblical fasting is a spiritual discipline that Jesus Himself encouraged while He was on earth. (Mathew 6:17-18) It refers to voluntary abstaining from food and drink for a specific period and for spiritual purposes (humbling yourself to seek God's face.) (Read Isaiah 58)

Fasting means putting away things you find pleasure in for the sake of God. It means pushing away things that are pleasant for you to seek God's face - for instance, love of tea, coffee, cake, chips, chocolate, etc. It could also include things like social media, TV, etc. Fasting is essentially saying, "This much Oh God, I need you, I thirst for you"

This is an "I GET TO experience God thing". It is like going into heaven for a tune-up, so we can keep our passion for God and enjoyment of Him at a high level. Figure out what works for you, commit to it, and make it a part of your Christian experience forever. It should be a lifestyle for every Christian. Fasting should go hand in hand with prayer, otherwise, it'll just be a hunger strike!

### WHAT DOES FASTING DO?

Fasting increases your control over your life. We are spirits enclosed in bodies, however, most of the time, we let our bodies control our spirits. Fasting puts the control back in our hands so that our bodies can become servants to the Lord. Fasting does not change God and His standards of righteousness or His will, but it changes us. In other words, God doesn't need it, we do!






- Fasting Changes things: Fasting changes the destiny of nations and individuals. (Jonah 3:5-10). God will not despise a broken and contrite heart (Psalm 51:17)
- FastingbringsGod's power into difficult situations: Divine guidance and wisdom come as we wait on God in prayer and fasting. (Deuteronomy 9:7-11)
- Fasting revives us: The power of self is reduced through surrender and God can then have greater freedom to work in us. (Philippians 2:13)
- Fasting purifies us spiritually: It is a spiritual discipline that keeps us engaged with God when we willingly give up our pleasures to focus on God.
- Fasting leads to brokenness: Fasting being an expression of humility and repentance, helps us in our submission and reverence of God as He works in us.

# **Substituting Meals**

- Each day many of us are likely to spend a lot of our time on meals thinking about what we're going to eat, then shopping, then cooking, then serving it, eating, and eventually cleaning up! It's possible to spend multiple hours of our day just on food.
- · However, when you are on a fast, you are able to clear out that extra space so you can create time with God, and that is something that pleases God.
- Fasting can ideally save you so much time, that you may not even know what to do with it! That is why our encouragement is that during the fast, all meal times should be spent in prayer and the word.
- In essence, at meal times, don't stick around your office or class, vanish! Take a prayer walk, or sit somewhere outside and read your bible and pray.





Every one of those days, spend extra time with the Lord. You could for example read 5 books of the bible in one week! In the evening, cook and take care of your family if they are not fasting - sit on the table and bless them - and participate in your family devotions! Pray for your family.

### **DIFFERENT TYPES OF FASTS**

A number of fasts exist; these include:

- PARTIAL FAST Having a restricted diet like Daniel didforthedurationyou have proposed. (Daniel 10:2-3)
- NORMAL FAST when you skip meals all through the day and have one meal at night OR a Liquid Fast whenyouskipallmealsandonlytakewaterandjuices
- **ABSOLUTE FAST** –This is a dry fast where you can go up to 3 days without water and food. (Esther 4:16)

We are encouraging our community to engage in a normal or liquid fast for the 21 days but as you feel led!

A liquid fast means no solid food, when you are essentially denying yourself the greatest pleasure of life - eating food! In the scriptures, we see the likes of Moses, Daniel, Ezekiel, and Jesus engaging in these types of fasts at different points.


### PREPARING FOR YOUR FAST

Here are some of the simple tips to help you prepare for your fast:

# 1. Set an objective for your fast.

Is there something you want to trust God for this season? Is it a spiritual renewal and growth? Is it for guidance? For healing? For the resolution of a certain problem in your life and family? For special grace to handle a difficult situation?





Ask the Holy Spirit to clarify what He wants you to take away from this time. This will enable you to pray more specifically and strategically.

# 2. Commit to your fast

For Jesus, it was a matter of when, not if, his followers would fast. (Matthew 6:16-18; 9:14-15). Before you fast, decide on...

# a. How long you will fast?

We are doing a 21-day community fast. If you are unable to commit to that long, I encourage you to at least go for 7 days or 14 days.

# b. What type of fast?

We are encouraging a liquid fast for our community, but if you have a serious health condition, please consult with your doctor before you begin.

# c. What physical or social activities will you restrict?


While you should be able to carry on with many of your normal activities, you could choose to restrict some in order to focus on prayer.

# d. How much time each day will you devote to prayer and God's Word?

The idea is to substitute your normal meal times with time in prayer. However, you could, for example, decide to do a one-hour prayer walk each lunch time to pray through the items on the prayer guide.

Making these commitments ahead of time, writing them down and even sharing with someone you trust will help you sustain your fast when physical temptations and life's pressures tempt you to abandon it.





# 3. Prepare Spiritually

Pray about your upcoming time of fasting. Ask God to give you an expectant heart and show you any areas of your life that need to be aligned to His will. Pray for spiritual protection over yourself and your family as you fast. The enemy will often intensify the natural battle between body and spirit (Galatians 5:16-17).

# 4. Prepare Physically

Don't binge eat before the fast begins! Cut down on caffeine, high fat and sugary foods several days before the fast. Raw fruits and veggies are a great way to condition your body for the fast!


### The Importance of Water:

- While fasting, drink a lot of room-temperature water.
- The average temperature in your body is 56 degrees cold water could easily shock your system leading you to end up with gastric cramps. Even for juice don't drink iced drinks, especially after the 3rd day of your fast. Hot drinks can also help.
- Try and drink at least 8 glasses (21) of roomtemperature water a day; this will help your system clean itself up. For juices, stick to nonacidic juices such as apple, papaya, sugarcane, watermelon, grapefruit, or coconut. Herbal tea without caffeine with a little honey also works.
- · Remember, whenever gastric juices cause you irritation and acidity drink water.

### **TIPS WHEN FASTING**

- 1. Drink lots of water. (at least 2L daily at room temperature)
- 2. Spend your freed-up meal times in prayer and reading God's word
- 3. Go to work you'll be even more productive! Exercise regularly. (Though modest)





- 4. Look nice, dress up, clean up. Don't go around announcing to everyone! If anyone asks, why aren't you eating? Then say; oh, I am not eating today; That's it! Don't get into any arguments about it.
- 5. When breaking your fast, do it gradually, begin by drinking fluids or very light meals as your body adjusts. Never break a long fast with solid protein, could cause you harm!
- 6. Have an accountability partner or a prayer partner; After all the Bible says, two are better than one! (Ecclesiastes 4:9)
- 7. Expect Transformation- Long for and expect change as you fast. Seek to draw closer to God and learn His will.

There's more of the Spirit and more of God than any of us are experiencing. I want to go there, not just intellectually, but in life, with everything I am (Francis Chan...) Can this be our prayer too? As an individual? As a Church?


Additional scriptures

John 13:34-35; Colossians 3:16; Psalm 136:1








- Thank God for His unfailing love and faithfulness to us.

• Thank God for your identity in Christ. Give thanks that you are chosen, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, and God's very own possession, called to reflect His goodness.








- Thank God for access to His presence. Express gratitude for the privilege of entering His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise, freely worshiping Him.

Psalm 128:2 (NIV): You will eat the fruit of your labor; blessings and prosperity will be yours.



Proverbs 14:23; Colossians 3:23–24 Ecclesiastes 3:13; 2 Thessalonians 3:10–12


### Reflection

- Praise God for the skills, talents, and opportunities He has entrusted to you for His glory.








- Thank God for every provision that has come through your labor, food, shelter, resources, and more.

# **Additional scriptures**


John 15:5; Galatians 5:22-23

- Thank God for the relationships He has placed in your life that encourage, sharpen, and bless you to be Christlike








- Praise God for fruitfulness in ministry, work, and every sphere of influence He has given you.

# Saturday 10th January 2026: Thanksgiving for healing and comfort


Psalm 147:3(NIV): He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds.

**Additional Scriptures** 



- Thank God for sustaining you through illness, weakness, or chronic conditions with His grace and presence.








- Praise God for doctors, nurses, medics, other good samaritans, medicine, and treatments He has used as instruments of healing in your life.

# Sunday 11th January 2026: Gratitude for God's faithfulness in our lives


Isaiah 65:24 (NIV): Before they call I will answer; while they are still speaking I will hear.








- Thank God for His faithfulness to your family, for protection, provision, healing, unity, and spiritual growth across generations.



Additional Scriptures: Lamentations 3:22–23; Psalm 136:1; Psalm 118:1; 1 Chronicles 16:8–12



 Thank God for 30 years of unwavering faithfulness, guidance, and spiritual growth.








- Praise God for the founders, pastors, elders, and leaders who obeyed His calling.

• Pray for unity, love, and spiritual maturity among all members and ministry teams.








- Ask God to keep the church anchored in Christ and faithful to Scripture.

- Ask God to deepen discipleship, fellowship, and commitment so the church shines brightly nationwide.








# Wednesday 14th January 2026: Evangelism, Outreach & Global Mission


Additional Scriptures: Acts 1:8; Mark 16:15; Romans 10:14–15; 2 Corinthians 5:20; Isaiah 6:8



# Thursday 15th January 2026: Spiritual Renewal, Holiness & Revival



- Pray for strength to walk in holiness, purity, obedience, and sensitivity to God's voice.








- Ask God to break spiritual strongholds that hinder growth, fruitfulness, and spiritual freedom.



 Pray for strength, wisdom, integrity, and Christlike character for all church leaders and pastors.










# Monday 19th January 2026: Reconciliation Across the Nation

Colossians 3:13–14 (NIV): "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity."

Additional Scriptures: 2 Corinthians 5:18–19; Psalm 133:1; Ephesians 4:2–3; Micah 6:8;1 Timothy 2:1–2; Isaiah 58:12

**Reflection:** God has called us to be agents of reconciliation. Kenya has faced divisions rooted in politics, tribe, and mistrust. As we fast and pray, we ask the Lord to heal broken relationships, restore unity, and raise leaders who pursue dialogue and peace.

- Pray that the church will model reconciliation, forgiveness, and unity, becoming a beacon of hope.








- Ask God to raise a generation marked by compassion, empathy, and quick forgiveness, overcoming division and bitterness.

- Intercede for those who have suffered violence, corruption, or marginalization to find strength in God's mercy.








- Pray for healing in political, judicial, and social institutions where mistrust has taken root.

John 13:34-35: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."



- Pray that the church will model Christ's love, becoming a beacon of unity.








- Ask God to raise Gen Z and future generations to lead with love and care for others.

- Intercede for integrity, justice, and accountability in law enforcement and military institutions.








- Pray for wisdom among leaders to resolve disputes peacefully and protect citizens.

Psalm 85: 6: "Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you?"



- Intercede for believers to share the gospel fearlessly in workplaces, schools, and communities.








- Pray for young people to encounter Christ and lead their peers into salvation.

### Sat 24th January 2026: Integrity, Thanksgiving & Hope for Kenya's Future


Proverbs 29:4: "By justice a king gives a country stability, but those who are greedy for bribes tear it down."








- Pray for the exposure and dismantling of corrupt systems that drain Kenya's resources and hinder her destiny.


